22	(a) The developer of any project projected to generate either 25 new peak-hour trips per day
22	or 249 total trips per day using the latest version of the Institute of Transportation
23 24	Engineers (ITE) Trip Generation Manual is required to submit a traffic impact analysis
25	(TIA) to determine the level of service (LOS) of road intersections within the study area.
26	If a development will generate fewer than 25 new peak-hour trips per day or 249 total
27	trips per day, or if the LOS of an affected intersection is graded "E" or "F," the City may,
28	at its discretion, require a TIA.

30	(b) ((The TIA shall be conducted by a traffic engineering firm that is agreed upon by the City
31	and the developer, to include specific requirements as established by the City Department
32	of Public Works. All costs for this TIA shall be borne by the developer.)) THE CITY
33	WILL SELECT THE TRAFFIC CONSULTANT TO PERFORM THE TIA AND THE
34	DEVELOPER SHALL PAY IN ADVANCE ALL COSTS BEFORE THE CITY WILL

All approval of nonresidential preliminary subdivision plans and site plans for 17 development shall be subject to determination of adequacy of road intersections in 18 19 accordance with this Subsection C. 20 (1) Traffic impact analysis. 21 22 (a) The developer of any project projected to generate either 25 new peak-hour trips per 23 day or 249 total trips per day using the latest version of the Institute of Transportation 24 Engineers (ITE) Trip Generation Manual is required to submit a traffic impact analysis 25 (TIA) to determine the level of service (LOS) of road intersections within the study 26 area. If a development will generate fewer than 25 new peak-hour trips per day or 249 27 28 total trips per day, or if the LOS of an affected intersection is graded "E" or "F," the City may, at its discretion, require a TIA. 29 30 (b) ((The TIA shall be conducted by a traffic engineering firm that is agreed upon by the 31 City and the developer, to include specific requirements as established by the City 32 Department of Public Works. All costs for this TIA shall be borne by the developer.)) 33 THE CITY WILL SELECT THE TRAFFIC CONSULTANT TO PERFORM THE 34 TIA AND THE DEVELOPER SHALL PAY IN ADVANCE ALL COSTS BEFORE 35 THE CITY WILL ORDER THE PREPARATION OF THE TIA. THE DEVELOPER 36 SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY COSTS INCURRED BY THE CITY AND 37 TRAFFIC CONSULTANT DUE TO ANY CHANGES IN PROJECT SCOPE THAT 38 OCCUR DURING THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE TIA. 39 40 41 (c) The TIA shall be prepared, signed, and sealed by a traffic engineer, or a civil engineer licensed in the State of Maryland who is qualified to practice traffic engineering. 42 43

ABERDEEN, that this Ordinance shall become effective at the expiration of twenty (20) calendar
days following adoption.
