# City of Aberdeen Business Meeting, Work Session March 10, 2014

The meeting was called to order at 4:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers by Mayor Bennett.

### **Business Meeting: Matters of Immediate and Urgent Business**

1. MRWA Award Recognition

Mayor Bennett presented the following awards from the Maryland Rural Water Association for 2013: Josh Quesenbery for Collection Operations Specialist, and Paul Visser for Water System of the Year.

2. Resolution 14-R-03; Resolution of Support for Mason Dixon Home Care, LLC

A motion was made by Councilwoman Young and seconded by Councilwoman Landbeck to approve Resolution 14-R-03; Resolution of Support for Mason Dixon Home Care, LLC.

The motion was passed with a vote of 5 - yes; 0 - no.

3. Award, Stadium Parking Lot Paving

Mr. Miller explained that the second coat of asphalt for the Ripken Stadium parking lot was not finished due to budget restrains; however, due to the efforts of Delegate Mary Dulany-James, Aberdeen obtained a \$450,000 bond bill for capital needs. The paving is scheduled to be done between March 24 – April 4, 2014. There was a 5% bid bond posted.

A motion was made by Councilman Garner and seconded by Councilwoman Young to award the low bidder, Daisy Concrete, Inc. of Maryland, Bid No. 14-01, Ripken Stadium Parking Lot Paving and Striping in the amount of \$412,000.

The motion was passed with a vote of 5 - ves; 0 - no.

## Work Session (4:12 p.m.)

- Campaign finance ordinance amendments were discussed including the consideration of mileage reimbursement. Mr. Miller added that the Election Board had reviewed the amendments.
- 2. Planning Commission Primer Ms. Grover stated that after the next Planning Commission meeting, she will report back to the Council, the Planning Commission's proposed changes on the integrated business district.
- 3. Legislative Session Mid-Point Report Mr. Miller and Mayor Bennett reported on Maryland Municipal League's priorities and their position on certain legislative bills currently under consideration in the Maryland General Assembly.

- 4. Boat and RV Storage Mr. Miller said that there will be an ordinance to address the options discussed by the Council. This would be a matter that the Planning Commission needs to review pertaining to Chapter 235.
- 5. Residential Parking Permits Mr. Miller explained that the municipal parking lot has been used inappropriately for storage, parking, etc. A concept of creating a residential parking permit for a nominal cost will be considered.

#### 6. FYI

- a. Constant Yield Tax Rate There will not be a constant yield tax rate process due to non-growth of the assessable tax base.
- b. Destination Harford Guide The guide was given to the Council that featured an ad from the City.
- c. Reenactment of Sediment Control Regulations An ordinance pulled off of the State model will be presented to the Council in the near future.
- d. Retreat A Council retreat will be held at the Elks Club in Abingdon, Maryland on March 14 and 15.

**Other:** The Aberdeen Police Department was thanked for their help with parking issues. The Mayor announced upcoming meeting dates.
