**SECTION 1. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABERDEEN** that §IV. The Mayor, Section IV.7; §V. The City Council, Section V.17; and §VII. Elections and Board of Elections, <u>Section Sections VII.6</u>, VII.10, VII.11 and VII.12, of the Charter of the City of Aberdeen (as published by General Code Corporation), are amended to read as follows:

#### § IV. The Mayor.

7. ((In)) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SECTION IV.8 OF THIS CHARTER, IN case of a vacancy in the office of Mayor, for any reason, the Council shall, by a majority vote of the entire Council, elect a person satisfying the qualifications in § IV.3 to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the unexpired term.

#### § V. The City Council.

- 17. A. EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION B. OF THIS SECTION, ((In)) IN the case of a vacancy in the office of Council member, that office shall be filled by the Mayor with the approval of the majority of the remaining members of the Council. The results of any such vote for vacancy in the office of City Council shall be recorded in the minutes or journal of the Council.
  - B. IN THE CASE OF A VACANCY ARISING FROM THE FAILURE TO ELECT A PERSON TO SERVE AS COUNCIL MEMBER BECAUSE OF A TIE VOTE BETWEEN TWO OR MORE CANDIDATES RECEIVING THE HIGHEST NUMBER OF VOTES FOR COUNCIL MEMBER AT A CITY ELECTION, THE VACANCY SHALL BE FILLED AS PROVIDED IN THIS SUBSECTION B.
    - I. THE VACANCY SHALL BE FILLED BY A SPECIAL RUN-OFF ELECTION BETWEEN THE CANDIDATES WHO RECEIVED THE SAME NUMBER OF VOTES AT THE CITY ELECTION. THE ABERDEEN BOARD OF ELECTIONS PROMPTLY SHALL NOTIFY THE CANDIDATES IN WRITING OF THE DATE OF THE RUN-OFF ELECTION.

- THE RUN-OFF ELECTION SHALL BE CONDUCTED NOT MORE THAN 30 II. BUSINESS DAYS AFTER THE ABERDEEN BOARD OF ELECTIONS CERTIFIES THE RESULTS OF THE CITY ELECTION IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION VII.12 OF THIS CHARTER.
- A CANDIDATE MAY DECLINE TO PARTICIPATE IN A RUN-OFF III. ELECTION BY FILING WITH THE ABERDEEN BOARD OF ELECTIONS CITY CLERK A WRITTEN AND NOTARIZED DECLINATION OF PARTICIPATION WITHIN 48-HOURS TWO BUSINESS DAYS AFTER THE BOARD NOTIFIES THE CANDIDATES OF THE DATE OF THE SPECIAL IF A CANDIDATE'S DECLINATION OF PARTICIPATION LEAVES ONLY ONE REMAINING CANDIDATE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE RUN-OFF ELECTION, THE RUN-OFF ELECTION SHALL NOT BE HELD AND THE REMAINING CANDIDATE SHALL BE DEEMED TO BE ELECTED.
- IF A RUN-OFF ELECTION RESULTS IN A TIE VOTE, ANOTHER RUN-OFF IV. ELECTION SHALL BE CONDUCTED BETWEEN THE CANDIDATES RECEIVING THE SAME NUMBER OF VOTES AT THE RUN-OFF THE SUBSEQUENT RUN-OFF ELECTION SHALL BE ELECTION. CONDUCTED NOT MORE THAN 30 BUSINESS DAYS AFTER THE ABERDEEN BOARD OF ELECTIONS CERTIFIES THE RESULTS OF THE PRIOR RUN-OFF ELECTION IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION VII.12 OF THIS CHARTER.
  - IF A SECOND RUN-OFF ELECTION RESULTS IN A TIE VOTE, THE NEWLY ELECTED CITY COUNCIL SHALL DECIDE, BY THE AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF A MAJORITY OF THE ENTIRE COUNCIL, WHICH OF THE TIED CANDIDATES IS THE WINNER OF THE ELECTION. IF NO WINNER IS SELECTED BY THE AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF A MAJORITY OF THE ENTIRE COUNCIL WITHIN 30 BUSINESS DAYS AFTER THE ABERDEEN BOARD OF ELECTIONS CERTIFIES THE RESULTS OF THE SECOND RUN-OFF ELECTION, THE ABERDEEN BOARD OF ELECTIONS SHALL DECIDE THE WINNER OF THE ELECTION BY A GAME OF CHANCE DETERMINED AND CONDUCTED BY THE BOARD IN PUBLIC BETWEEN THE TIED CANDIDATES.

## § VII. Elections and Board of Elections.

The official voter registration list for City ((election)) ELECTIONS shall be the list of qualified voters maintained by the County Board of Elections. NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS CHARTER, ONLY THOSE INDIVIDUALS WHOSE NAMES APPEARED ON THE OFFICIAL VOTER REGISTRATION LIST IN EFFECT FOR THE REGULAR ELECTION IN WHICH THERE WAS A TIE VOTE MAY VOTE IN A RUN-OFF ELECTION AUTHORIZED BY SECTIONS IV. 8 OR V.17.B. may assist the County Board of Elections with the advertising of voter registration efforts and policies.

10. The Aberdeen Board of Elections shall provide for each special and general election a suitable place or places for voting and suitable ballot boxes and ballots and/or voting machines. The ballots and/or voting machines shall show the name of each candidate nominated for elective office in accordance with the provisions of the City Charter, arranged in alphabetical order by office with no party designation of any kind. The Aberdeen Board of Elections shall keep the polls open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on election days, or for longer hours if required by the Council. If the Board decides to use voting machines at any election, the method of use shall be in the same manner provided in the Election Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland as the Aberdeen Board of Elections deems appropriate. NOTWITHSTANDING THE OTHER PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION 10, THE BOARD OF ELECTIONS MAY CONDUCT A SPECIAL RUN-OFF ELECTION AUTHORIZED BY SECTIONS IV.8 AND V.17.B. OF THIS CHARTER BY A MAIL-IN BALLOT ACCORDING TO PROCEDURES ESTABLISHED BY THE BOARD AND APPROVED BY THE COUNCIL BY RESOLUTION.

11. ((All)) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN § VII.10 FOR A MAIL BALLOT, ALL special City elections shall be conducted by the Aberdeen Board of Elections in the same manner and with the same personnel, as far as practicable, as regular City elections.

12. By noon on the Friday after the closing of the polls, the Aberdeen Board of Elections shall determine the vote cast for each candidate and question and shall certify the results of the election and the elected officials to the Council, which shall have the results recorded in the minutes or journal of the Council. IF A SPECIAL RUN-OFF ELECTION IS CONDUCTED BY MAIL-IN BALLOT AS AUTHORIZED BY § VII.10, NOT LATER THAN FOUR CALENDAR BUSINESS DAYS FOLLOWING THE DEADLINE FOR RECEIPT OF MAIL-IN BALLOTS THE BOARD OF ELECTIONS SHALL DETERMINE THE VOTES CAST FOR EACH CANDIDATE AND SHALL CERTIFY THE RESULTS OF THE ELECTION AND THE ELECTED OFFICIAL TO THE COUNCIL, WHICH SHALL HAVE THE RESULTS RECORDED IN THE MINUTES OR JOURNAL OF THE COUNCIL.

**SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABERDEEN** that new <u>Section IV.8 is Sections IV.8 and 9 are</u> added to the Charter of the City of Aberdeen (as published by General Code Corporation), §IV. The Mayor, to follow immediately after Section IV.7 and to read as follows:

§ IV. The Mayor.

- 8. IN THE CASE OF A VACANCY ARISING FROM THE FAILURE TO ELECT A PERSON TO SERVE AS MAYOR BECAUSE OF A TIE VOTE BETWEEN TWO OR MORE CANDIDATES RECEIVING THE HIGHEST NUMBER OF VOTES FOR MAYOR AT A CITY ELECTION, THE VACANCY SHALL BE FILLED AS PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION.
  - A. THE VACANCY SHALL BE FILLED BY A SPECIAL RUN-OFF ELECTION BETWEEN THE CANDIDATES WHO RECEIVED THE SAME NUMBER OF VOTES AT THE CITY ELECTION. THE ABERDEEN BOARD OF ELECTIONS PROMPTLY SHALL NOTIFY THE CANDIDATES IN WRITING OF THE DATE OF THE RUN-OFF ELECTION.
  - B. THE RUN-OFF ELECTION SHALL BE CONDUCTED NOT MORE THAN 30 BUSINESS DAYS AFTER THE ABERDEEN BOARD OF ELECTIONS CERTIFIES THE RESULTS OF THE CITY ELECTION IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION VII.12 OF THIS CHARTER.
  - C. A CANDIDATE MAY DECLINE TO PARTICIPATE IN A RUN-OFF ELECTION BY FILING WITH THE <u>ABERDEEN BOARD OF ELECTIONS</u> <u>CITY CLERK</u> A WRITTEN <u>AND NOTARIZED</u> DECLINATION OF PARTICIPATION WITHIN <u>48 HOURS</u> TWO BUSINESS DAYS AFTER THE BOARD NOTIFIES THE CANDIDATES OF THE DATE OF THE SPECIAL ELECTION. IF A CANDIDATE'S DECLINATION OF PARTICIPATION LEAVES ONLY ONE REMAINING CANDIDATE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE RUN-OFF ELECTION, THE RUN-OFF ELECTION SHALL NOT BE HELD AND THE REMAINING CANDIDATE SHALL BE DEEMED TO BE ELECTED.
  - D. IF A RUN-OFF ELECTION RESULTS IN A TIE VOTE, ANOTHER RUN-OFF ELECTION SHALL BE CONDUCTED BETWEEN THE CANDIDATES RECEIVING THE SAME NUMBER OF VOTES AT THE RUN-OFF ELECTION. THE SUBSEQUENT RUN-OFF ELECTION SHALL BE CONDUCTED NOT MORE THAN 30 <u>BUSINESS</u> DAYS AFTER THE ABERDEEN BOARD OF ELECTIONS CERTIFIES THE RESULTS OF THE PRIOR RUN-OFF ELECTION IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION VII.12 OF THIS CHARTER.
  - E. IF A SECOND RUN-OFF ELECTION RESULTS IN A TIE VOTE, THE NEWLY ELECTED CITY COUNCIL SHALL DECIDE, BY THE AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF A MAJORITY OF THE ENTIRE COUNCIL, WHICH OF THE TIED CANDIDATES IS THE WINNER OF THE ELECTION. IF NO WINNER IS SELECTED BY THE AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF A MAJORITY OF THE ENTIRE COUNCIL WITHIN 30 BUSINESS DAYS AFTER THE ABERDEEN BOARD OF ELECTIONS CERTIFIES THE RESULTS OF THE SECOND RUNOFF ELECTION, THE ABERDEEN BOARD OF ELECTIONS SHALL DECIDE

THE WINNER OF THE ELECTION BY A GAME OF CHANCE DETERMINED AND CONDUCTED BY THE BOARD IN PUBLIC BETWEEN THE TIED CANDIDATES.

9. NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS CHARTER, IN THE EVENT OF A TIE VOTE IN AN ELECTION FOR THE OFFICE OF MAYOR, THE INCUMBENT MAYOR SHALL REMAIN IN OFFICE UNTIL THE MAYOR'S SUCCESSOR QUALIFIES AND TAKES OFFICE.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABERDEEN that the date of adoption of this Resolution is December 19, 2016, and the amendment of the Charter of the City of Aberdeen hereby enacted shall become effective on February 7, 2017, unless a proper petition for referendum hereon shall be filed as permitted by law, provided a complete and exact copy of this Resolution shall be continuously posted on the bulletin board in Aberdeen City Hall until January 30, 2017, and provided further that a copy of the title of this Resolution shall be published in The Record, a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Aberdeen, or in any other newspaper of such general circulation, once in each of the weeks beginning December 23, 2016, December 30, 2016, January 6, 2017, and January 13, 2017.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABERDEEN that the City Clerk is hereby specifically commanded to carry out the provisions of Section 3, hereof, and, as evidence of such compliance, the City Clerk shall cause to be maintained appropriate certificates of publication of the newspaper or newspapers in which the title of the Resolution shall have been published. If a favorable referendum is held on the Charter change, the Mayor shall proclaim the Charter change hereby enacted to have been approved by the voters and the charter amendment shall become effective on the date provided by law.

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABERDEEN that as soon as the Charter Amendment hereby enacted shall become effective, either as provided herein or following a referendum, the City Clerk shall send by mail to the Department of Legislative Services of Maryland, a clear certified copy of this Resolution showing the number of Councilpersons voting for and against it and a report on the votes cast for or against the amendment hereby enacted at any referendum thereon and the date of such referendum.

 The above Charter Amendment was enacted by the foregoing Resolution which was passed at a regular meeting of the Council of the City of Aberdeen on December 19, 2016, five (5) members of the Council voting in the affirmative, zero (0) members of the Council voting in the negative, zero (0) members of the Council abstaining, and zero (0) members of the Council absent, and the said Resolution becomes effective accordance with the law on the 7th day of February, 2017.
