SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABERDEEN, that Sections 36-1, 36-2, 36-4.A. and 36-5.A., of Chapter 36 ELECTIONS, of the

Code of the City of Aberdeen (2010 Edition as amended), are repealed and reenacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

CHAPTER 36 ELECTIONS

§ 36-1. Qualifications of candidates.

A certificate of candidacy, as referenced in the City Charter, in a form RECOMMENDED BY THE MAYOR AND approved by the CITY COUNCIL ((City Manager)), shall be submitted by each candidate to the Board of Elections or its authorized representative during the prescribed time period. The certificate of candidacy must be accompanied by a fee of \$25. Candidates may withdraw their candidacy no later than 30 days prior to election, in writing. The candidate must satisfy all qualifications for office as established in the Aberdeen City Charter. The certificate of candidacy must state the period during which the candidate has been domiciled in the City.

§ 36-2 Review by Board of Elections.

Within five business days after the last day for filing certificates of candidacy, the Board of Elections shall review the certificates of candidacy to determine whether the candidates are eligible for election to the office which each candidate seeks. Within 10 business days after last day for filing a certificate of candidacy, the Ethics Commission shall review each candidate's financial disclosure form required by Chapter 43 of this Code and report its findings to the Board of Elections in that same time period. In the event that the Board shall find that the candidate is not eligible for election, or that the candidate has not satisfactorily completed the financial disclosure form, the Board shall reject the certificate of candidacy and so advise the candidate. THE CANDIDATE SHALL HAVE TWO (2) BUSINESS DAYS TO REMEDY AND RESUBMIT THE FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE FORM FOLLOWING NOTIFICATION FROM EITHER THE BOARD OF ELECTIONS OR THE ETHICS COMMISSION. FAILURE OF A CANDIDATE TO TIMELY FILE A CORRECTED FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE FORM SHALL RESULT IN DISQUALIFICATION OF THE CANDIDATE.

§ 36-4 Campaign treasurer and campaign contribution accountability.

((The)) THE candidate shall name a treasurer who will be responsible for receiving and disbursing all campaign funds AND SHALL IDENTIFY THE NAME OF AN ESTABLISHED CAMPAIGN FINANCE ACCOUNT TO RECEIVE CONTRIBUTIONS. The treasurer's name must appear on all campaign materials, advertisements, etc. No other individual or group may spend money directly to aid the candidate unless the person/group is identified and so states that information; all such support should be directed through the treasurer. The campaign treasurer shall provide to the Board a telephone number with answering service capabilities, an e-mail address, or both, that the candidate and/or campaign treasurer will regularly monitor during the campaign. For printed campaign material, the treasurer's name and/or authority line shall appear in such a manner that it

- is clearly legible. For each electronic campaign material, including web pages, social media, and robotic telephone calls, a message acknowledging that the treasurer and candidate approve of the electronic campaign material shall be provided in the electronic campaign material. The treasurer shall provide the Board electronic evidence that this approval message was included on each electronic campaign material.
 - § 36-5 Reporting and disposition of contributions and expenditures.
 - A. A report(s) of all moneys spent and received shall be filed with the Aberdeen Board of Elections on a form provided by the Board. The initial and subsequent reports shall be consecutively filed as follows:
 - (1) FOR CANDIDATES WHO FILE A NOTICE OF CANDIDACY INTENT DECLARATION, NO LATER THAN THE FRIDAY BEFORE LABOR DAY IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING ANY MUNICIPAL ELECTION;
 - (((1))) (2) No later than the fourth Tuesday immediately preceding any municipal election;
 - (((2))) (3) No later than the second Friday immediately preceding any election which shall be complete through and including the preceding Sunday;
 - (((3))) (4) No later than the third Tuesday after the municipal election; AND
 - (((4))) (5) No later than January 31 following a municipal election, the candidate shall file a final report with the Board. That report shall give a full account of how any surplus funds were disposed of in compliance with § 36-5B.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABERDEEN, that new Sections 36-4A and 36-11 be and they are hereby added to Chapter 36, ELECTIONS, of the Code of the City of Aberdeen (2010 Edition as amended), to follow immediately after Sections 36-4 and 36-10, respectively, and to read as follows:

CHAPTER 36 ELECTIONS

§ 36-4A. PRECANDIDACY CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS.

A. ANY PERSON WHO INTENDS TO SOLICIT OR RECEIVE CONTRIBUTIONS, INCUR EXPENSES OR LOAN FUNDS TO THE PERSON'S CAMPAIGN ("CAMPAIGN FINANCE ACTIVITY") PRIOR TO FILING A CERTIFICATE OF CANDIDACY SHALL SUBMIT A NOTICE OF CANDIDACY INTENT DECLARATION TO THE BOARD OF ELECTIONS, BUT NOT EARLIER THAN THE FIRST BUSINESS DAY IN AUGUST. A PERSON MAY NOT ENGAGE IN ANY

§ 36-11 ABSENTEE/MAIL-IN BALLOTS.

ABSENTEE BALLOTS, WHICH MAY BE REFERRED TO AS MAIL-IN BALLOTS FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, MAY BE REQUESTED BY ELIGIBLE REGISTERED VOTERS OF THE CITY OF ABERDEEN THROUGH THE HARFORD COUNTY BOARD OF ELECTIONS. THE CITY MUST PROVIDE NOTICE OF APPLICATION AVAILABILITY, THE DEADLINES FOR REQUESTING AND CASTING A MAIL-IN BALLOT, AND THE METHODS FOR CASTING A MAIL-IN BALLOT AS SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTIONS B. AND C. OF THIS SECTION.

MAIL-IN BALLOTS MAY BE MAILED TO THE CITY OF ABERDEEN BOARD OF В. 29 ELECTIONS AT THE CITY'S MAILING ADDRESS AT CITY HALL. IN ORDER TO 30 BE ACCEPTED, A MAILED BALLOT MUST BE POSTMARKED BY 8:00 P.M.
