5 **FOR** the purpose of amending the adopted budget for the City of Aberdeen for the fiscal year
6 beginning July 1, 2016 and ending June 30, 2017, to appropriate for certain purposes
7 certain funds from the City’s unrestricted fund balances, and add additional revenue to
8 the General Fund and generally related to amendment of the City’s FY 2017 budget.

12 **SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE**
13 **CITY OF ABERDEEN** that the “City of Aberdeen Budget Fiscal Year 2016-2017” adopted by
14 Ordinance No. 16-O-12 is amended as follows:

- 15
16 1. Increase the Transfers, Dept. No. 800, appropriation for “Transfer to Sewer Fund”
17 from \$0 to \$247,000.
18
19 2. Increase General Fund “Appropriation of Fund Balance” Revenue No. 40998 from
20 \$507,000 to \$754,000.
21
22 3. Increase Total General Fund appropriation from \$15,746,420 to \$15,993,420.
23
24 4. Increase the Total Revenues General Fund from \$15,746,420 to \$15,993,420.
25

26 **SECTION 2: AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE MAYOR AND**
27 **COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABERDEEN** that the sums and amounts reflected in Section 1
28 of this Ordinance are hereby appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016, and ending
29 June 30, 2017.

1 **FOR** the purpose of amending the December 1996, and revised November 2001 adopted City of
2 Aberdeen Employee Personnel Policy Manual.

4 **WHEREAS**, adopted December 9, 1996 the City of Aberdeen Employee Personnel Policy
5 Manual concerns rules and responsibilities for employees of the City of Aberdeen; and

7 **WHEREAS**, the Employee Personnel Policy Manual was revised in November of 2001; and
8
9 **WHEREAS**, the City of Aberdeen Employee Personnel Policy Manual has been carefully
10 reviewed by Human Resources and the City Manager. A copy of the revisions were originally
11 given to the Mayor and Councilmembers on October 10, 2016 for review; and
12
13 **WHEREAS**, during a Work Session on November 14, 2016, Human Resources gave an
14 overview of the changes to the Employee Personnel Policy Manual.

16 **THEREFORE, LET IT BE ENACTED** by the Mayor and Council of the City of Aberdeen
17 that this Ordinance shall become effective at the expiration of twenty (20) calendars days
18 following adoption.

1 **SECTION 1. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF**
2 **ABERDEEN** that §IV. The Mayor, Section IV.7; §V. The City Council, Section V.17; and §VII.
3 Elections and Board of Elections, Section VII.10, VII.11 and VII.12, of the Charter of the City of
4 Aberdeen (as published by General Code Corporation), are amended to read as follows:

5
6 **§ IV. The Mayor.**
7

8 7. ((In)) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SECTION IV.8 OF THIS CHARTER, IN case of a
9 vacancy in the office of Mayor, for any reason, the Council shall, by a majority vote of the
10 entire Council, elect a person satisfying the qualifications in § IV.3 to fill the vacancy for the
11 remainder of the unexpired term.
12

13 **§ V. The City Council.**
14

15 17. A. EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION B. OF THIS SECTION, ((In)) IN the case
16 of a vacancy in the office of Council member, that office shall be filled by the Mayor with
17 the approval of the majority of the remaining members of the Council. The results of any
18 such vote for vacancy in the office of City Council shall be recorded in the minutes or
19 journal of the Council.
20

21 B. IN THE CASE OF A VACANCY ARISING FROM THE FAILURE TO ELECT A
22 PERSON TO SERVE AS COUNCIL MEMBER BECAUSE OF A TIE VOTE
23 BETWEEN TWO OR MORE CANDIDATES RECEIVING THE HIGHEST NUMBER
24 OF VOTES FOR COUNCIL MEMBER AT A CITY ELECTION, THE VACANCY
25 SHALL BE FILLED AS PROVIDED IN THIS SUBSECTION B.
26

27 I. THE VACANCY SHALL BE FILLED BY A SPECIAL RUN-OFF ELECTION
28 BETWEEN THE CANDIDATES WHO RECEIVED THE SAME NUMBER OF
29 VOTES AT THE CITY ELECTION. THE ABERDEEN BOARD OF
30 ELECTIONS PROMPTLY SHALL NOTIFY THE CANDIDATES IN WRITING
31 OF THE DATE OF THE RUN-OFF ELECTION.

1 II. THE RUN-OFF ELECTION SHALL BE CONDUCTED NOT MORE THAN 30
2 DAYS AFTER THE ABERDEEN BOARD OF ELECTIONS CERTIFIES THE
3 RESULTS OF THE CITY ELECTION IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION
4 VII.12 OF THIS CHARTER.

5
6 III. A CANDIDATE MAY DECLINE TO PARTICIPATE IN A RUN-OFF
7 ELECTION BY FILING WITH THE ABERDEEN BOARD OF ELECTIONS A
8 WRITTEN DECLINATION OF PARTICIPATION WITHIN 48 HOURS AFTER
9 THE BOARD NOTIFIES THE CANDIDATES OF THE DATE OF THE
10 SPECIAL ELECTION. IF A CANDIDATE’S DECLINATION OF
11 PARTICIPATION LEAVES ONLY ONE REMAINING CANDIDATE TO
12 PARTICIPATE IN THE RUN-OFF ELECTION, THE RUN-OFF ELECTION
13 SHALL NOT BE HELD AND THE REMAINING CANDIDATE SHALL BE
14 DEEMED TO BE ELECTED.

15
16 IV. IF A RUN-OFF ELECTION RESULTS IN A TIE VOTE, ANOTHER RUN-OFF
17 ELECTION SHALL BE CONDUCTED BETWEEN THE CANDIDATES
18 RECEIVING THE SAME NUMBER OF VOTES AT THE RUN-OFF
19 ELECTION. THE SUBSEQUENT RUN-OFF ELECTION SHALL BE
20 CONDUCTED NOT MORE THAN 30 DAYS AFTER THE ABERDEEN
21 BOARD OF ELECTIONS CERTIFIES THE RESULTS OF THE PRIOR RUN-
22 OFF ELECTION IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION VII.12 OF THIS
23 CHARTER.

24
25 **§ VII. Elections and Board of Elections.**

26
27 10. The Aberdeen Board of Elections shall provide for each special and general election a
28 suitable place or places for voting and suitable ballot boxes and ballots and/or voting
29 machines. The ballots and/or voting machines shall show the name of each candidate
30 nominated for elective office in accordance with the provisions of the City Charter, arranged
31 in alphabetical order by office with no party designation of any kind. The Aberdeen Board of
32 Elections shall keep the polls open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on election days, or for longer
33 hours if required by the Council. If the Board decides to use voting machines at any election,
34 the method of use shall be in the same manner provided in the Election Article of the
35 Annotated Code of Maryland as the Aberdeen Board of Elections deems appropriate.
36 NOTWITHSTANDING THE OTHER PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION 10, THE
37 BOARD OF ELECTIONS MAY CONDUCT A SPECIAL RUN-OFF ELECTION
38 AUTHORIZED BY SECTIONS IV.8 AND V.17.B. OF THIS CHARTER BY A MAIL-IN
39 BALLOT ACCORDING TO PROCEDURES ESTABLISHED BY THE BOARD AND
40 APPROVED BY THE COUNCIL BY RESOLUTION.

1 11. ((All)) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN § VII.10 FOR A MAIL BALLOT, ALL special City
2 elections shall be conducted by the Aberdeen Board of Elections in the same manner and
3 with the same personnel, as far as practicable, as regular City elections.
4

5 12. By noon on the Friday after the closing of the polls, the Aberdeen Board of Elections shall
6 determine the vote cast for each candidate and question and shall certify the results of the
7 election and the elected officials to the Council, which shall have the results recorded in the
8 minutes or journal of the Council. IF A SPECIAL RUN-OFF ELECTION IS CONDUCTED
9 BY MAIL-IN BALLOT AS AUTHORIZED BY § VII.10, NOT LATER THAN FOUR
10 CALENDAR DAYS FOLLOWING THE DEADLINE FOR RECEIPT OF MAIL-IN
11 BALLOTS THE BOARD OF ELECTIONS SHALL DETERMINE THE VOTES CAST
12 FOR EACH CANDIDATE AND SHALL CERTIFY THE RESULTS OF THE ELECTION
13 AND THE ELECTED OFFICIAL TO THE COUNCIL, WHICH SHALL HAVE THE
14 RESULTS RECORDED IN THE MINUTES OR JOURNAL OF THE COUNCIL.
15

16 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE**
17 **CITY OF ABERDEEN** that new Section IV.8 is added to the Charter of the City of Aberdeen
18 (as published by General Code Corporation), §IV. The Mayor, to follow immediately after
19 Section IV.7 and to read as follows:
20

21 **§ IV. The Mayor.**
22

23 8. IN THE CASE OF A VACANCY ARISING FROM THE FAILURE TO ELECT A
24 PERSON TO SERVE AS MAYOR BECAUSE OF A TIE VOTE BETWEEN TWO OR
25 MORE CANDIDATES RECEIVING THE HIGHEST NUMBER OF VOTES FOR
26 MAYOR AT A CITY ELECTION, THE VACANCY SHALL BE FILLED AS PROVIDED
27 IN THIS SECTION.
28

29 A. THE VACANCY SHALL BE FILLED BY A SPECIAL RUN-OFF ELECTION
30 BETWEEN THE CANDIDATES WHO RECEIVED THE SAME NUMBER OF
31 VOTES AT THE CITY ELECTION. THE ABERDEEN BOARD OF
32 ELECTIONS PROMPTLY SHALL NOTIFY THE CANDIDATES IN WRITING
33 OF THE DATE OF THE RUN-OFF ELECTION.
34

35 B. THE RUN-OFF ELECTION SHALL BE CONDUCTED NOT MORE THAN 30
36 DAYS AFTER THE ABERDEEN BOARD OF ELECTIONS CERTIFIES THE
37 RESULTS OF THE CITY ELECTION IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION
38 VII.12 OF THIS CHARTER.
39

40 C. A CANDIDATE MAY DECLINE TO PARTICIPATE IN A RUN-OFF
41 ELECTION BY FILING WITH THE ABERDEEN BOARD OF ELECTIONS A
42 WRITTEN DECLINATION OF PARTICIPATION WITHIN 48 HOURS AFTER
43 THE BOARD NOTIFIES THE CANDIDATES OF THE DATE OF THE

1 SPECIAL ELECTION. IF A CANDIDATE'S DECLINATION OF
2 PARTICIPATION LEAVES ONLY ONE REMAINING CANDIDATE TO
3 PARTICIPATE IN THE RUN-OFF ELECTION, THE RUN-OFF ELECTION
4 SHALL NOT BE HELD AND THE REMAINING CANDIDATE SHALL BE
5 DEEMED TO BE ELECTED.
6

7 D. IF A RUN-OFF ELECTION RESULTS IN A TIE VOTE, ANOTHER RUN-OFF
8 ELECTION SHALL BE CONDUCTED BETWEEN THE CANDIDATES
9 RECEIVING THE SAME NUMBER OF VOTES AT THE RUN-OFF
10 ELECTION. THE SUBSEQUENT RUN-OFF ELECTION SHALL BE
11 CONDUCTED NOT MORE THAN 30 DAYS AFTER THE ABERDEEN
12 BOARD OF ELECTIONS CERTIFIES THE RESULTS OF THE PRIOR RUN-
13 OFF ELECTION IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION VII.12 OF THIS
14 CHARTER.
15

16 **SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE**
17 **CITY OF ABERDEEN** that the date of adoption of this Resolution is _____, 2016, and
18 the amendment of the Charter of the City of Aberdeen hereby enacted shall become effective on
19 _____, 2016, unless a proper petition for referendum hereon shall be filed as permitted by
20 law, provided a complete and exact copy of this Resolution shall be continuously posted on the
21 bulletin board in Aberdeen City Hall until _____, 2016, and provided further that a copy
22 of the title of this Resolution shall be published in The Record, a newspaper of general
23 circulation in the City of Aberdeen, or in any other newspaper of such general circulation, once
24 in each of the weeks beginning _____, _____, _____, and _____, 2016.
25

26 **SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE**
27 **CITY OF ABERDEEN** that the City Clerk is hereby specifically commanded to carry out the
28 provisions of Section 3, hereof, and, as evidence of such compliance, the City Clerk shall cause
29 to be maintained appropriate certificates of publication of the newspaper or newspapers in which
30 the title of the Resolution shall have been published. If a favorable referendum is held on the
31 Charter change, the Mayor shall proclaim the Charter change hereby enacted to have been
32 approved by the voters and the charter amendment shall become effective on the date provided
33 by law.
34

35 **SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE**
36 **CITY OF ABERDEEN** that as soon as the Charter Amendment hereby enacted shall become
37 effective, either as provided herein or following a referendum, the City Clerk shall send by mail
38 to the Department of Legislative Services of Maryland, a clear certified copy of this Resolution
39 showing the number of Councilpersons voting for and against it and a report on the votes cast for
40 or against the amendment hereby enacted at any referendum thereon and the date of such
41 referendum.
42

43 The above Charter Amendment was enacted by the foregoing Resolution which was
44 passed at a regular meeting of the Council of the City of Aberdeen on _____, 2016,
45 _____ members of the Council voting in the affirmative, _____ members of the Council voting in

1 the negative, ____ members of the Council abstaining, and ____ members of the Council absent,

6. The official voter registration list for City ((election)) ELECTIONS shall be the list of qualified voters maintained by the County Board of Elections. NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS CHARTER, ONLY THOSE INDIVIDUALS WHOSE NAMES APPEARED ON THE OFFICIAL VOTER REGISTRATION LIST IN EFFECT FOR THE REGULAR ELECTION IN WHICH THERE WAS A TIE VOTE MAY VOTE IN A RUN-OFF ELECTION AUTHORIZED BY SECTIONS IV. 8 OR V.17.B. The City may assist the County Board of Elections with the advertising of voter registration efforts and policies.

Amendment No. 18

On page 3, immediately following line 4, of the proposed Charter Amendment, insert the following:

- V. IF A SECOND RUN-OFF ELECTION RESULTS IN A TIE VOTE, THE NEWLY ELECTED CITY COUNCIL SHALL DECIDE, BY THE AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF A MAJORITY OF THE ENTIRE COUNCIL, WHICH OF THE TIED CANDIDATES IS THE WINNER OF THE ELECTION.
