# CITY OF ABERDEEN Business Meeting, Work Session August 10, 2015

The meeting was called to order at 4:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers by Mayor Bennett.

### 1. Matters of Immediate and Urgent Business

a. Budget Amendment, Police Equipment

The Council discussed the purpose and need for civil disturbance equipment. A motion was made by Councilwoman Landbeck and seconded by Councilman Smith to approve a budget amendment in the amount of \$26,800 to purchase equipment for the Aberdeen Police Department to be used for civil disturbances.

### The motion was passed with a vote of 5 – yes.

b. Budget Amendment, Paving

A motion was made by Councilwoman Elliott and seconded by Councilwoman Landbeck to approve \$310,000 for paving completion of the Hillcrest Project.

### The motion was passed with a vote of 5 -yes.

c. Bid Award, Waste Water Treatment Plant (WWTP) Cascade Repair

The Council discussed the cost of the cascade repairs. A motion was made by Councilwoman Landbeck and seconded by Councilman Smith to approve Bid Award No. 15-08, Advanced Waste Water Treatment Cascade Area Access Improvements Erosion Repair, to Civil Utility Construction Company, Inc. of Aberdeen, Maryland, in the amount of \$173,196 to repair a receding stream bank for the Waste Water Treatment Plant.

### The motion was passed with a vote of 5 - yes.

d. Ordinance No. 15-O-08, Personnel Manual Amendment

Mayor Bennett introduced Ordinance No. 15-O-08, Personnel Manual Amendment.

e. Resolution No. 15-R-06, Medline Industries, Inc.

Resolution No. 15-R-06, would endorse a loan from the Maryland Department of Business and Economic Development to Medline Industries, Inc. in the amount of \$125,000 for expansion of its distribution operations and renovations at 100 Rock Glenn Boulevard, Havre de Grace, Maryland. It also endorsed a workplace employee training grant in the amount of \$60,000 over a 3-year period from Harford County, Maryland. No City of Aberdeen money was involved.

A motion was made by Councilman Smith and seconded by Councilwoman Young to approve Resolution No. 15-R-06, Medline Industries, Inc. a \$125,000.00 loan to Medline Industries, Inc. and a \$60,000 Harford County training grant with no City money used.

## The motion was passed with a vote of 5 - yes.

- 2. Work Session
  - a. Public Works
    - West Side Water Tower: Mr. Miller explained the need for a new elevated water storage tower in the area to the west of I-95. Mr. Torster explained the location, purpose, history, and technical aspects of the tower. It would meet current peak demands and future supply allocations. The City also proposed to use ARRO Consulting, Inc. as its engineering firm for design and technical assistance. A request for proposal was anticipated to be issued the summer of 2016. Council discussion followed.
  - b. ISO Rating: Mr. Torster stated that the City's Insurance Selective Organization (ISO) rating/score had improved. He explained the rating process and how insurance companies use these ratings as markers to determine insurance rates.
  - c. Miscellaneous
    - Comcast Renewal: The Comcast contract was due for renewal. The City was asking for: free drops into the municipal buildings; 2-way fiber for the City's future disaster recovery site at Ripken Stadium; a 3% franchise fee of their gross income paid quarterly; a fiber connection between Public Works and municipal buildings. A public hearing was scheduled for the September Council meeting.

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- 2) MML Takeaways: The Council was asked for their thoughts on the summer Maryland Municipal League Convention.

There would also be a \$21,000 budget amendment for an evaluation of the Moose Lodge. A community meeting would be scheduled for public input.
