MARYLAND ENERGY ADMINISTRATION SUPPORT OF ENERGY POLICIES AND PLANS

1 WHEREAS, the Maryland Energy Administration (MEA) has benchmarked the State's 2 progress and evaluated additional policy options to increase momentum in advancing the State's energy goals and policies initiated by Governor O'Malley and the Maryland General Assembly: 3 4 and 5 WHEREAS, the City of Aberdeen is making a commitment to these policies and plans to be a local leader in reducing electricity and petroleum consumption in City-owned buildings and 6 City-owned vehicles; and 7 8 WHEREAS, the City of Aberdeen is setting a goal to reduce electricity consumption by 9 establishing an electricity consumption baseline for calendar year 2011 and developing a plan with 10 the goal to reduce per-square foot electricity consumption in City-owned buildings by 15% within 11 5 years of adoption; and 12 WHEREAS, the City of Aberdeen is also setting a goal to reduce on-road petroleum

(gasoline and diesel fuel) consumption by 20% within 5 years of the baseline year; and

14	WHEREAS, the City of Aberdeen supports sustainable development by reducing energy	
15	consumption, develo	ping infrastructure to facilitate sustainable development, and supporting
16	efforts to reduce electricity and petroleum consumption; and	
17	WHEREAS, 1	he City of Aberdeen will promote energy and water conservation efforts and
18	promote sustainable economic development for the well-being of our residents and corporate	
19	citizens.	
20	Section 1. No	OW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and City Council of
21	the City of Aberdeen that these goals are hereby adopted as follows:	
22	(a)	Establish an electricity consumption baseline for calendar year 2011 and
23		develop a plan with the goal to reduce per square foot electricity
24		consumption of City-owned buildings by 15% within 5 years of adoption.
25	(b)	Establish a petroleum consumption baseline for all local government
26		vehicles, and put in place a comprehensive program designed to reduce the
27		baseline by 20% within 5 years of the baseline year.
28	Section 2.	AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Mayor and City Council of
29	Aberdeen that a plan will be adopted to further address these goals. The Departments of Public	
30	Works and Planning	and Community Development will be responsible for the implementing,
31	reporting, and tracking progress towards meeting these goals.	
32	Section 3.	AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Mayor and City Council of
33	Aberdeen, that this R	esolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption.
